<p>Recognizing that issues like youth homelessness, food insecurity, and lack of transportation require collaboration, the LCCF seeks to create partnerships in service to the community and to play a role in growing charities. The LCCF has contributed more than \$300,000 to nonprofits in Leslie County.</p> <p>The LCCF board members identified pressing areas to address: small business development, retention, and growth; downtown revitalization; and substance abuse recovery.</p> <p>Over the next three years, the Leslie County Community Foundation will focus on growing the economy, addressing youth homelessness, supporting substance abuse recovery, and growing resources from within and outside the community.</p>	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);">Overarching Strategies:</p> <p>1. Economic Growth Collaborate with Chamber on workshops for business owners and to grow Chamber membership; support downtown revitalization</p> <p>2. Youth Support Through PLACE, support youth planning and fundraising for projects to develop life skills and address substance abuse and mental health.</p> <p>3. Substance Abuse Recovery Build relationships with community partners to understand needs.</p> <p>4. Arts and Heritage Continue support of Kentucky School of Bluegrass; refurbish community building that will include arts spaces.</p> <p>5. Grow Resources/ Endowment Seek regional and national grants; create a Club 404 Endowment Campaign; hold fundraising events.</p>	<p style="writing-mode: vertical-rl; transform: rotate(180deg);">Indications of Success:</p> <p>Over the next three years...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small business owners will report increased food traffic and revenue. • Youth in PLACE will increase their fund to balance to \$10,000 • Board will understand how to support addressing substance abuse issues and be ready to plan how to do so. • LCCF will donate an average of \$7,500 per semester in scholarships to the Kentucky School of the Bluegrass. • Leslie County will have a community space, including an arts space, and the LCCF will generate revenue from some uses of the space. • LCCF will receive at least two regional or national grants per year. • The endowment will grow by \$640,000 (in four years). • Fundraising events will raise \$12,000 per year.
